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INTRODUCTION




If Einstein's iconic equation, $E = MC^2$, were applied to the spiritual life, it would look like this:

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THE LOGIC OF GOD'S EXISTENCE

From the unfathomable mysteries in the ocean depths to the dance of life in the densest jungles to the celestial constellations of distant stars, the exquisite order and breathtaking beauty of the natural world offers compelling evidence of a governing intelligence.

By definition, belief in God requires a leap of faith; but it's a leap that is amply supported by logic and reason. Given that persuasive evidence points to the existence of a complex web of intelligent consciousness that expresses itself as an <u>entanglement</u> <u>inherent in all creation</u>, it follows that God—the formless intelligence that created us—is present in every atom of creation and that every atom is connected to every other atom beyond space and time. Therefore, the divine consciousness that created us is present in each one of us. It is reasonable then to embrace the definition of God put forth by the sages of ancient India: *God is that supreme intelligence which governs everything.*

In those moments when we purely, selflessly, and reverently embody and express the higher virtues of love and truth, we come into alignment with our inner divinity and feel the perfect peace and ever-new bliss that come with God-union. We know these moments to be holy, and experience for ourselves that God is synonymous with love, truth, and beauty. Therefore, it is rational to conclude that God is loving, kind and benevolent.

In those moments when life seems cruel and God seems anything but loving, explanations and perhaps some measure of comfort may be found in the concepts of karma, reincarnation, and free will, which are touched on in later chapters.



THE LOGIC OF SURRENDERING TO DIVINE WILL

Given that a supreme, loving intelligence governs all of existence, it follows that you are being guided in every moment with infinite wisdom and inexhaustible love. Surrendering to this Divine Intelligence, which essentially means aligning your will with God's will, is the cornerstone of a spiritual life.

When you attune your will to Divine Will, you awaken to the joyous realization that life is unfolding in a way that has your best interests in mind. You recognize that every challenge you are presented with is a gift, an opportunity for you to more fully embrace and express the truth of your divine nature. If you desire more peace, purpose, and joy in your life, surrendering to God is the most logical and practical choice you can make.

Surrendering to God does not mean that you are surrendering your free will. It means you are dedicating your life to a higher purpose, to serve as a living expression of truth, beauty, and love. Surrendering is nothing more than a homecoming, a recognition that your will aligns with Divine Will as naturally as a child's hand fits into its mother's.

How do you distinguish Divine Will from your own thoughts and desires? Develop your intuition, which is a direct conduit to Divine Intelligence. Unlike your thoughts, intuition is free from emotional attachments and value judgments. You can further enhance your ability to align with Divine Will through the regular practice of spiritual affirmations, meditation, and practicing the presence of God. Practicing the presence means keeping your love for God in your thoughts as often as possible and maintaining an ongoing dialogue with God.

Inevitably, surrendering to Divine Will generates a virtuous circle. By relinquishing the misguided belief that life is fully under your control, you become more trusting, which frees up your attention for the present moment, which heightens your awareness of the beauty that surrounds you, which assures you of the perfection of Divine Intelligence, which strengthens your devotion, which naturally leads to joyous surrender to God.



THE LOGIC OF DIVINE GUIDANCE

Divine Intelligence speaks to you through your conscience and your intuition. Your conscience flows from and is an expression of your intuition, which in turn flows from and is an expression of Divine Consciousness. Your conscience, then, is a direct pipeline to God. The more you trust in your ability to tune in to your intuitive wisdom, the easier it will be to access it.

Relying on logic alone to guide your actions will take you only so far. A great intellect is a great blessing; it can also be a great curse if it blocks you from accessing the wisdom of your heart. Your intellectual decisions are biased by the quality of your knowledge, the influence of your belief system, and your unique psychological profile. Your intuitive promptings bypass these personal biases and harmonize your actions with Universal Intelligence.



THE LOGIC OF ALIGNING WITH SPIRIT INSTEAD OF EGO

You cannot make meaningful progress on a spiritual path until you align yourself more with your spirit than with your ego. Ego and spirit are polar opposites. When the soul aligns itself with the mind and body, it unconsciously manifests as ego. When the soul realizes its Divine nature, it transcends the body-consciousness of the ego, expresses itself as spirit, and joyously aligns with Spirit.

If your ego is driving your quest for enlightenment instead of operating in service to your spirit, enlightenment will remain forever beyond your reach. The more you empty yourself of your ego and your own self-importance, the more room there is to welcome your spirit.

The difference between your ego and your spirit is the difference between thinking and awareness. Thinking is realization via the self-contained content of your mind. Awareness is Self-realization via conscious attunement with Divine Intelligence.

Your spirit is the angel on your left shoulder, reassuring you that you are a perfect creation of God, that you already have everything you need. Your ego is the devil on your right shoulder, incessantly whispering that you are stronger or weaker than others, that you are entitled to or are unworthy of riches, that you must always look out for number one or for everyone but yourself.

Lose yourself in ego and you unconsciously act selfishly. Lose yourself in Spirit and you consciously act selflessly. The higher you raise your consciousness, the more often you ask yourself, *Is what I'm doing right now serving God*? You move closer to enlightenment every time you remind yourself to be a "servant of Spirit" instead of an "emperor of ego."



THE LOGIC OF PRAYER

There are three kinds of prayer:

- prayers of supplication (requesting something for yourself)
- intercessory prayer (requesting something for others)
- devotional prayer (yearning for attunement with Divine Will)

PRAYERS OF SUPPLICATION

How your prayer for a worldly desire is answered depends on the level of your surrender and the purity of your intent. The greater your longing to selflessly serve Spirit instead of selfishly serving your ego, the more likely that your request will be granted in a form that you recognize and consider favorable. If your desire is coming from ego instead of spirit, it is likely self-serving and a hindrance to your spiritual progress. Expect the attainment of an ego-driven desire to come with a corrective lesson attached. Is that a price worth paying? Ask King Midas.

Aligning your will with God's will presents an intriguing paradox. On one hand, the more attuned you are to Divine Consciousness, the more accessible are the riches of the Universe. On the other hand, the material items you longed for before you put God first in your life now seem like insignificant trinkets. Your desire for earthly possessions diminishes in direct proportion to your yearning for God-intoxication.

INTERCESSORY PRAYER

Offering an intercessory prayer with all the sincerity of your heart delivers love and healing energy to the individual you are praying for. Numerous scientific experiments have confirmed that compassionately praying for others can have a direct impact on their well-being.

Granted, mental and spiritual energy operate beyond the scope of what science can measure or language can explain. However, given that we are all connected to one another through the divine consciousness that is present in every particle of creation, "energy" can be considered a metaphor for the instantaneous effect of compassionate human intention.

Still, there are so many factors in play—the recipient's karmic debts, sacred contracts, and will to live, to name a few—that your prayer may not *appear* to affect the ultimate outcome. So why bother to pray? No matter what the result, the loving energy you transmit may ease the recipient's pain, comfort their soul, and bolster their strength and resolve. Deep healing occurs when you

initiate a loving prayer and allow Divine Intelligence to do with it what it will.

DEVOTIONAL PRAYER

Nurturing an intimate relationship with God is the essence of devotional prayer. It is not your words that are important but the purity and intensity of your yearning for Divine communion. Devotional prayer does not ask anything of God, except perhaps for deeper understanding that furthers your spiritual progress or insight into how you can best be of service.

Consistent devotional prayer generates a virtuous circle. Every prayer elevates your consciousness, which brings you closer to God, which brings you greater peace and deepens your devotion, which inspires you to pray more frequently. Strive to live your life as one long prayer, and in time you will feel God's presence in all your waking hours.



THE LOGIC OF MEDITATION

Through the spiritual science of meditation, you can experience the peace of direct personal contact with God. Meditation is not an emptying of the mind, it is the highest form of concentration in which the mind is focused entirely on God. Meditation quiets the mind, calms the senses, opens the heart, and prepares you to receive Divine Consciousness.

Meditation must be entered into with pure intent and infinite patience. God will respond in God's time, not yours. What we call happiness is negligible compared to the inner peace and exultation of spirit we attain in meditation. Happiness, the province of the ego, is fleeting. Joy, the natural state of the soul, is infinite and eternal.

Enriching your inner life is only half the equation. If the peace and unconditional love you feel in meditation is not expressed through your every action, then you are not truly living a spiritual life. The goal of meditation is not to avoid the world, but to live in it more consciously and fully in ways that serve humanity.



THE LOGIC OF BEING PRESENT

Given that God is real, changeless, and eternal, and the material world and everything in it is an expression of God-consciousness and ultimately ephemeral, it is safe to describe God as the only true Reality. Since all of creation emanates from—and exists within—the mind of God, the world in which we live can be considered unreal in the sense that it is a "dream" of God.

It follows then that time is an illusion, existing only in our minds, which are extensions of the Divine Mind. Indeed, space and time are confined to the physical world (reality). In the realms beyond human consciousness (Reality), where God resides, there is only the Eternal Now.

As our consciousness expands and we become aware of this awareness, we awaken within the dream. We see that the present moment is the only moment we have ever had or ever will have. Since the present moment is both ephemeral and infinite, it exists outside of time, which means presence is a timeless state of being. Therefore, your capacity to be fully present expands dramatically when you stop identifying yourself as a time-bound human being separate from others, and start experiencing life as a timeless spiritual being at one with all creation. Stay anchored in the present moment and you will know the joy of living a life without limits.



THE LOGIC OF HUMILITY

Humility is a fundamental element of the spiritual life. Enlightened masters who have achieved union with Divine Consciousness have transcended the ego. The notion that these selfless saints would flaunt their abilities is unthinkable; holiness and humility walk hand in hand.

The more you identify with your ego, the less humble you will be. You may think you are acting selflessly, but your ego is always thinking, *What's in it for me*? The ego will be disappointed whenever a slice of humble pie isn't washed down with recognition and praise.

Your spiritual development requires humility and surrender; humility is the absence of ego, which clears the way for surrender to Spirit. Humility in no way implies inability, inferiority, or insignificance. Those who surrender to Spirit discover that in humility lies true strength and empowerment. Why? Because when you align your will with Divine Will, you are allowing God to act through you. God's voice becomes your voice. In this exalted state of consciousness, you effortlessly see the world through God's eyes and act instinctively on God's behalf.

Humbly choosing to live with a positive, loving attitude is eminently logical. After all, when you choose to fill your days with love, there is no downside, and the upside is experiencing heaven on earth.



THE LOGIC OF SERVICE

The more you align your will with God's will, the more naturally you view others with empathy, love, and compassion. The more attuned you are to Divine love, the more you yearn for others to experience the joy and peace that love has brought you.

When you shift from being self-centered to other-centered, you cannot look anywhere without seeing opportunities to help, comfort, or inspire others. As you evolve into an instrument of God's love, your mere presence becomes an act of service.

When you live solely to please God through selfless service instead of pleasing yourself or anyone else, you are liberated from the prison of other people's expectations and judgments.

You serenely accept the consequences of your actions, knowing that if God is pleased, you have all you will ever need, even if the world takes everything else away from you. Serving others is love in action, as long as it is not tainted by your ego's desire for recognition. Doing good deeds so others think of you as someone who does good deeds keeps you tightly entwined in the arms of ego, oblivious to Spirit's welcoming embrace.

You are acting selfishly when your service flows from the promptings of your ego, your focus is on what you can get, and you walk away feeling unappreciated and resentful. You are acting selflessly when your service flows from the purity of your spirit, your focus is on what you can give, and you walk away feeling happy and peaceful.

Service to others is an effect, not a cause; it flows naturally out of your devotion and surrender to God. Awaken to the joy of service, and serving others transitions from being a conscious choice to an instinctive driving force.



THE LOGIC OF MAGNETIC THOUGHTS

Your thoughts (expressions of your individual consciousness) immediately connect you to all of creation through the Unified Field (the omnipresent expression of Divine Consciousness that includes your "individual" consciousness). This exchange of information mimics the exchange of energy yet operates beyond the boundaries of space and time.

Ultimately, where your attention goes, "energy" flows. Since every action generates a reaction, every thought produces a response. Since like energy attracts like energy, you will magnetically attract whatever you think about into your life.

The state of your reality, then, is a reflection of your state of mind, which is determined by the quality of your thoughts. This Universal Law is at work in your own life whether or not you are conscious of it. Indeed, your thoughts are like paving stones, shaping a path into a future of your own making.



THE LOGIC OF FULFILLING YOUR DESIRES

You set an amazing process in motion by asking the Universe for whatever it is you want. The quality of the outcome hinges on the quality of your efforts to fulfill four conditions.

First, have unshakable faith that your request will be granted. If you don't believe it, you won't receive it. It is not your thoughts and words but the conviction behind them that carry the most weight, that ensure that you and your desire become a vibrational match.

Second, want what you want for the right reasons. Why is intent important? The more genuine your desire to love and serve God, the nearer you approach that sacred space where God's intentions become your intentions.

Third, have complete clarity about the desired outcome. Concentrate intensely until you can visualize it in meticulous detail. The mind thinks in pictures, which are shaped not by your words, but by the energy—either love or fear—fueling your request. If your fears keep you focused on what you do *not* want—"I am not going to end up broke"—your mind's eye will conjure up that which you are most fearful of.

Fourth, *feel* throughout your body—physically and emotionally—every aspect of what you are praying for and visualizing. Lose yourself in the energy of your yearning. Feel the feeling of what its attainment feels like with all your senses. Your feeling *is* the prayer. You reach the tipping point when your desire *feels* fulfilled in your inner world.



THE LOGIC OF SEEING EVERY MOMENT AS A GIFT

Given that God is guiding each of us with infinite wisdom and inexhaustible love, it follows that God is an organizing force bringing divine order to the Universe, which means that nothing is random or accidental. Mishaps are simply evidence that God is redirecting you.

All it takes is a shift of perspective to recognize and appreciate life's gifts, even when—especially when—what you are experiencing seems like anything but a gift. Instead of passing judgment on what comes your way, challenge yourself to view unfavorable events as necessary steps toward fulfilling your life's purpose.

Interpreting incidents, relationships, and challenges symbolically, rather than literally, helps you perceive the deeper meaning of life experiences. Unplug from the need to know why something happened and trust that behind the event is a message of Divine empowerment. As soon as you make that shift, the message can be delivered.

Accepting whatever life delivers to you with humility and gratitude naturally leads you to act more positively in every situation, which in turn produces more favorable outcomes.

The beauty of reframing even the most challenging of moments as a gift is that doing so is a gift in itself. Even if the "divine purpose" you identify is wildly off the mark, the act of searching for meaning and purpose raises your consciousness, which ultimately leads you to live your life with more meaning and purpose.



THE LOGIC OF NON-ATTACHMENT

The Buddha stated that attachment to desires is the origin of suffering. The logic is clear: Given that everything in the material world is ultimately impermanent, your emotional attachment to whatever you desire may eventually lead to either disappointment or loss, and, ultimately, to suffering.

Attachment and desire feed on each other. The more attached you become to a desire, the more attractive the object of your desire becomes, which intensifies your attachment to it. What's more, obsessing about your desires blocks you from aligning your will with Divine Will. Attachment and attunement cannot coexist.

The same dynamic holds true for detaching from outcomes. If your happiness depends on achieving your goals precisely as you have envisioned, on events playing out according to your wishes, or on other people doing exactly what you want them to do, you are condemning yourself to a lifetime of misery. Detaching from outcomes does not mean that you are apathetic and unmotivated. You may still care deeply about the result of your efforts, but from an objective, enlightened perspective.

You are fully engaged in life while humbly acknowledging that a greater wisdom than your own is at work.

When a certain outcome is desired, some people choose to "let go and let God" while others adopt an aggressive "do it yourself" mindset. Reconcile this "free will vs. Divine Will" conundrum by doing what you feel guided to do while staying open to unanticipated outcomes.

Detaching from results in no way hinders your enjoyment of the process that leads to those results. Just the opposite is true: Detachment liberates you from worrying about the outcome, which frees you up to savor the present moment instead of looking past it. Inner peace is a greater prize than outer results; and it is the process, not the result, that brings peace and fulfillment.



THE LOGIC OF ADVERSITY

By definition, the circle of life demands that we experience the full range of what this life has to offer. It follows then that adversity is an integral part of the natural order of things. No one escapes its bittersweet embrace.

Adversity is often a signal that your current path is leading you in a direction away from your highest good. Until you transition from being reactive and learning through pain to being proactive and learning through joy, a calamity may be the only way for the Universe to get your attention.

If you cannot change what you are faced with, then you must face that you are meant not to change it, but to experience it. Our greatest lessons are often embedded in our greatest pain. We cry to the heavens, unaware that we are growing stronger and wiser even as we plead for mercy. You would not be the person you are today if you had never been brought to your knees by the vicissitudes of life.

How you feel about a challenge depends on how you choose to deal with it. You can call upon the best in you, or let it get the best of you. No matter how much discomfort it brings, every difficulty calls forth the heroic, noble qualities of your soul. How heroically you answer that call determines how fully you realize your divine potential.



THE LOGIC OF SUFFERING

Suffering can be a springboard for growth and self-discovery that ultimately enriches your life. A physical or emotional crisis can jolt you out of your comfort zone, reorder your priorities, spur you to make sweeping life changes, and deepen your trust in God's plan for your life.

Resisting your suffering or wallowing in it disrupts the flow of life and prevents you from healing. Surrender to your suffering and the gates of understanding swing open. Accepting that you cannot change what cannot be changed enables you to objectively deal with your suffering, free of judgment and emotional resistance.

Allow the energy of your suffering to descend upon you, to seep into your emotional pores as surely as water overtakes a sponge, for suffering is as purposeful as it is unstoppable. When you have experienced your grief as intensely as you can, brace yourself, and walk into it. Take heart; the further you travel into your suffering, the closer you are to overcoming it.

Recognizing, much less appreciating, the upside of suffering requires great maturity and wisdom. It may take years to realize that what was devastating at the time was instrumental in your spiritual growth.



THE LOGIC OF FORGIVENESS

"Forgiveness" is a loaded word that may anger those who have endured great wrongs. Substituting the word "release" for "forgiveness" short-circuits the emotional charge and reframes the act as a blessing that you bestow on yourself rather than one bestowed on your antagonist.

Forgiveness does not mean that you condone what was done to you or that you absolve the perpetrator of responsibility for his or her actions. How deserving your assailant is of your forgiveness is irrelevant. Forgiveness is a gift to yourself.

The moment you forgive, you reinvent yourself. Your psyche is flooded with light, forever dispelling the darkness that had emotionally crippled you. Instead of identifying yourself by past injuries and injustices, you are free to rewrite the story of who you are and who you wish to be. If you do not forgive, you are bound to the person who injured you as surely as if you were handcuffed together. By passionately defending your hatred and anger, you are snatching the knife from your adversary's hand and plunging it deeper into your own heart. The price of resentment is unending suffering. The priceless gift of forgiveness is lasting peace.



THE LOGIC OF REINCARNATION

The notion that we all live many lives enables the puzzle pieces of life to click into place. Without reincarnation, life on earth would hold less meaning and purpose. If we lived only one lifetime, an argument could be made that the Universe is a chaotic, random crapshoot that renders any spiritual insight, and indeed our very existence, as ultimately insignificant.

Reincarnation is consistent with the concept of a benevolent Universe in that you are given unlimited opportunities to learn what you need to learn, atone for your errors, and complete your soul's work. Reincarnation tells us that failure is temporary, success is assured, and every experience has value.

Over the course of innumerable lifetimes, you must experience the gamut of what it means to be human. Life can be viewed as a giant Bingo card of experiences on which every space must be filled with the essence of one of the tragedies or triumphs of life. If each of your lives was pleasant and uneventful, you would learn little. Soul growth demands that you also explore every last twist and turn in the dark alleyways of life.

Just as your childhood memories are stored within you, so are memories of your previous lives. While they may not be accessible, they are an integral part of who you are, shaping you and guiding you through all the many roles you play in the endless drama of life. Each incarnation allows you to begin anew so that you keep your focus on the lessons waiting for you in this life, undistracted by past events, memories, and relationships.



THE LOGIC OF KARMA

Call it karma, reaping what you sow, or what goes around comes around. Your every action is a cosmic tennis ball served into the court of Divine Intelligence. Every shot is impartially volleyed back—the law of cause and effect always demands its due.

Karma is not positive or negative; it is simply purposeful. There are karmic consequences for every choice you make and action you take, whether you are held accountable in this life or in a future incarnation. Actions that are harmonious with Divine Will produce results that we consider desirable; inharmonious actions produce undesirable results.

Reincarnation and karma explain why God's plan for you is ultimately determined by the exercise of your own free will. God provides the canvas and unceasing guidance, but leaves the painting of your life up to you. If God directly interfered in any way, not only would you be deprived of valuable experiences, the application of karmic law would be disrupted.



THE LOGIC BEHIND EVIL ACTS

Throughout history, people with malicious intent have exercised their free will to hurt others. That such cruelty is allowed to take place does not mean that God does not exist or does not care. The logic that explains such brutality can be expressed in two words: free will. We either have free will or we don't. God does not directly interfere in human affairs because, by definition, free will would be rendered meaningless if it were interfered with.

The ability of every individual to exercise their free will is the X-factor that creates a loophole in the premise that "everything happens for a reason." Given that Divine guidance may be thwarted by another individual's act of free will, it is more accurate to say that everything that happens has purpose or creates purpose. No matter what happens, God works with what happens to guide you back on course—often with new purpose-driven priorities—whenever possible.

Consequently, God's plan for each of us may weather continual course corrections, just as each move on a chess board reconfigures our universe of choices going forward. In extreme cases, our life's plan may be adapted, rewritten, or postponed. Even then, however, karmic forces are at work and angels hover near. One way or another, in this life or another, our soul lessons will play out as planned. Fulfillment is certain; circumstances and timing are not.



THE LOGIC BEHIND "WHAT IF?"

Given that logic, reason, and faith can only take you so far, the question has to be asked: What if the doubters are right? What if you are *not* being divinely guided, your calling is a figment of your imagination, and there are no soul lessons to be learned from adversity? I would still contend that applying these spiritual laws and trusting that a greater purpose is at work makes life more enjoyable and suffering more bearable.

Whether or not your beliefs are true, they shape the way you look at the world and determine how you experience life. Even in the absence of definitive proof that an organizing intelligence governs all creation, wouldn't you prefer to live in a benevolent and orderly Universe rather than suffer through a random, pinballlike existence in a world ultimately devoid of inherent purpose and meaning? At thirty-four, I was unemployed with a wife and twelve-year-old daughter to support. I didn't have highly marketable skills and was feeling more desperate by the day. I was already heavily in debt and had no idea how I was going to pay that month's rent, much less the looming IRS bill. I had to repeatedly remind myself to breathe.

A few weeks later, my dad asked me to meet him for lunch. We lived seventy miles apart so we met at a Wendy's in Monticello, a town halfway in between. We sat down and, without question, without judgment, he handed me a check for \$2,500. I was stunned. I knew he couldn't afford to give me so much. As I sat there, blinking back tears, he told me he believed in me and that he loved me. It was the most unexpected, generous, and loving gift I had ever received, and it deepened the already strong bond between us.

Fast-forward nearly six years. I asked my dad to meet me at the Wendy's in Monticello at three o'clock. He hadn't a clue why. We sat down, and I thanked him again for that day and told him how much his loving gesture had meant to me. Then I handed him a check for \$2,500. It was his turn to be stunned. He tried to thank me but was too overcome with emotion, so much so that he lowered his head to the table and began sobbing. Tenderly, I leaned over and kissed the top of his head. The gift of that moment remains one of the highlights of my life.

I am now grateful for those dark days of no job and no money. Enduring such a stressful period, with fear gnawing at the pit of my stomach for days on end, was a small price to pay for such beautiful moments of love, grace, and redemption. My dad is gone now, but the memories of those lunches at Wendy's continue to nourish me and feed my soul. Even if I were in debt the rest of my life, I'd still feel like the richest man on earth.
